55/99	<p><b>MATTERS OF URGENCY NOT ON THE AGENDA</b></p> <p>(a) Millennium Party</p> <p>Members heard from representatives of the committee set up to organise the Millennium party about the cost of events and agreed to underwrite the event to the sum of £1550 and to immediately pay to the committee £500 to help with booking and like expenses.</p>	
56/99	<p><b>MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF 2 MARCH 2000</b></p> <p>The Minutes of the meeting of 2 March 2000 were confirmed and signed by the Chairman as a true record.</p>	
57/99	<p><b>MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES</b></p> <p>(a) speed of traffic past Ford Prison</p> <p>The Clerk reported that the survey showed that the average speed was 31.5mph with 97% of vehicles doing below the speed limit of 60mph. He was asked to get more detailed figures.</p> <p>(b) Town and Parish Council meeting</p> <p>Cllrs Forster and Mrs Rudd reported on this meeting, highlighting a presentation on Aruns plans to deal with abandoned vehicles and on the need to limit the precept of parishes to inflation for the future since the increases would affect the amount Arun received from central government.</p>	Clerk
