26/00	APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE Apologies were received from Cllr John Baird	
27/00	MATTERS OF URGENCY NOT ON THE AGENDA	
28/00	MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF 17 AUGUST 2000 The Minutes of the meeting of 17 August 2000 were confirmed and signed by the Chairman as a true record.	
29/00	ADMINISTRATION (a) Village Newsletter Members congratulated the chairman on the success of the newsletter which she said had been very well received. Members agreed to offer to contribute to the funding of the newsletter if this was needed. (b) Beacon Bonfire The Clerk reported on a suggestion from a company that a beacon be lit on 31 December and it was agreed to take no further action on this. (c) Bailiffscourt Outward Bound events The chairman reported that she and Cllr James Baird had visited the event which they both felt was not unduly loud. As the events were only to be held during "normal working hours" they had no objection to it and members decided to take no further action. (d) Fly tipping. Members noted a letter from Arun DC about fly tipping in the area which suggested that there was not much of a problem in the parish. Cllr James Baird outlined reported on his experiences of Bread Lane and it was agreed to respond to Arun DC about concerns in the parish and stating that this problem would regularly be reported in the future. It was also agreed to put a piece in the newsletter giving a contact name for reporting fly tipping and asking about problems experienced generally in Bread Lane.	Clerk
30/00	FINANCE (a) Half Years Accounts The accounts were noted and members agreed to consider the budget at the next meeting. (b) Payment of accounts It was agreed to pay the Clerk £620 for the last quarters salary and expenses.	
31/00	PLANNING (a) CM28/00 Clovers, Yapton Road extension	<i>£15.</i> Clerk

(b) CM30/00 Sign on Horsemere Green Lane

(c) CM31/00 Sevenacres

Members had no objection to these proposals.

(d) 15/00 Twizzlewig (amended application)

Members repeated their previous objection that this building needed to match other properties in the area. They also agreed to write to Arun DC about this and (e) expressing their concern about the developments in the Lane proceeding without proper consideration of the highway capacity and layout, the problem with the junctions at either end of the Lane, the disposal of sewage and the disposal of surface water and indicating that they felt the objections of the council fell on deaf ears. It was also agreed to ask Arun DC exactly how these concerns were being addressed.

(e) CM32/00 Crophorne

Members agreed to object to this as indicated in (d) in that in particular the paragraphs in the application relating to foul and surface water disposal referred to existing systems and members did not know what this meant since there seemed to be none around. They also agreed to object on the basis of the lack of proper open space which all seemed to be confined to a point where traffic would be at its highest, so making a danger for children; and to the idea of 2½ storey development.

Members objected to the idea of naming some of the houses "Farm Cottages" and agreed to ask that an alternative be thought of and also asked whether reference to "The Beaches" should be "The Beeches" as there were no beaches near these houses.
