70/00	<p>PLANNING</p> <p>(a) Planning Lists 10-14 Cllr Forster reported that 16/00 (Land at Scyld, Horsemere Green Lane) was the only application. In respect of this application members agreed to raise the following issues:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Their concern about surface water drainage and the need to have this sorted out even before the decision on the application is taken so there is no repeat of problems elsewhere in the Lane.</li> <li>• They questioned the appropriateness of social housing on this site and in Clymping. Instead they supported the proposal for affordable housing instead subject to Arun Council identifying a need for this in the parish.</li> <li>• They felt that if there was to be planning gain from this development for the benefit of the local community then the developers should clean out the pond in the Lane situated close to the entrance to this site.</li> <li>• Details of the sewage disposal proposals should be provided.</li> <li>• The developers should demonstrate what their proposals are for dealing with the heavy vehicles which will be coming to the site during construction, especially as there will now be even more residents in the Lane who will be using the road.</li> <li>• A large number of trees have already been removed from this site and members wondered what further removal will be taking place as a result of the development.</li> </ul> <p>Members also agreed to ask for a reply to these on a point by point basis and</p>	<p>Clerk</p>

It was further agreed to ask whether and if so when enforcement action would be taken and to point out that members were now being asked to look at 16/00 where again no formal proposals had been made.
