41/01	<p>MATTERS OF URGENCY NOT ON THE AGENDA</p> <p>(a) Bread Lane right of way</p> <p>The Chairman reported that this matter had been delayed due to Foot and Mouth problems but would be looked at shortly.</p>	
42/01	<p>MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF 11 OCTOBER 2001</p> <p>The Minutes of the meeting of 11 October 2001 were confirmed.</p>	
43/01	<p>ADMINISTRATION</p> <p>(a) Children's Play Area</p> <p>Members agreed to write to Cllr John Baird asking if he would allow the play area to be placed on land he owns close to the Village Hall.</p> <p>(b) Question and Answer Session</p> <p>It was agreed to suggest this start at 7pm and that we consider inviting Ford as well. 45/01	<p>PLANNING</p> <p>(a) Planning Lists 41-45</p> <p>CM28/01 Farm Shop</p> <p>Members had no objection to this application provided the use was limited to some short term.</p> <p>CM32/01 Wells Cottage</p> <p>Members pointed out that parking restrictions seemed to apply to the area of land</p>	Clerk

They also thought that the proposal was inappropriate as having a significant visual impact in the rural character of the area to the south of the A259 and because it could lead to a loss of the remainder of the verge along this length of the Street</p> <p>Applications for Certificates of Lawfulness (Cllrs James Baird and Claire Baird declared an interest in this matter and took no part in the debate or decision)</p> <p>Members considered a number of applications from Cllr John Baird for certificates of lawfulness in respect of activities on his land and it was agreed that it was not appropriate for legal reasons for the parish council to make comment on these.</p> <p>(b) Waste Local Plan The Clerk reported on the fact that the Environment Agency was not aware of any problems and it was agreed just to check that the existing occupiers did hold a waste licence.</p> <p>(c) Sludge Operations A letter from Southern Water about the fact that sludge recycling had always been part of their permission was noted and it was agreed to ask Arun DC what conditions had been imposed to cover this aspect of the operations at Ford.</p>	<p>Clerk</p> <p>Clerk</p>
46/01	<p>HIGHWAYS</p> <p>(a) Co-ordinated Transport Plan Mr Tyrrell updated members on his ongoing efforts to secure support for the idea of a local transport plan for the area.</p> <p>(b) Ragwort Problems A letter from WSCC outlining their way of dealing with these issues was noted by members.</p> <p>(c) Works in Horsemere Green Lane Members noted that works to create footpaths had now started in the Lane and that previously the Council had been promised information about what was being proposed.
