These meetings were to become biannual unless urgency dictated an additional one. It was also reported that additional school warning signs were to be erected. School – The School Governors have discussed a traffic plan and in particular want an advisory one way system along Brookpit Lane. Viridor – Members agreed that with the decision on Viridor the Group should now draft a letter commenting on the traffic impacts of the vehicle movements and the Chairman agreed to circulate a letter he had written on this matter. Facilities on Beach – It was agreed that this should be deferred for the time being until it was known more certainly what would be happening in connection with the Shoreline Management Plan.
