(c) Civil Contingencies Co-ordinator Cllr Mrs Edge agreed to be the Co-ordinator for the parish. 103/05	<b>PLANNING</b> (a) Planning Lists 4-8 F/24/05 Sandy Bruce Trucking Members felt that this was on agricultural land and that the proposal would be the thin end of the wedge and should be opposed as expanding into a new area.  (b) Parish Plan Members listened to a presentation on this subject from the Local Councils Association and felt that the next approach would be to seek support for the	Clerk

104/05	<p><b>HIGHWAYS</b></p> <p>(a) Transport Group The following matters were particularly highlighted: “Drive Carefully” Sign. Members agreed that the sign should remain as it is. Viridor. Members agreed to contact Arun DC to be briefed on whether the Viridor site was indeed brownfield or not. South Coast Skips. Members felt that nothing had changed concerning this proposal and that our objections remained. It was also agreed to write to WSCC about their undertaking to monitor HGV vehicle movements in the area.</p> <p>(b) Visibility out of Horsemere Green Lane The Chairman said that he had met with the resident whose vehicle caused visibility problems and that she was sympathetic and co-operative. Flytipping was also a problem in the area and Cllr Biss agreed to raise this with the police as well.</p> <p>(b) Erosion of Beach Members noted that a representative of the Environment Agency would attend on 13 April to discuss this topic.</p> <p>(c) Felling of Trees along A259 Members noted a letter from Arun DC which set out the progress of the felling and the plans for replanting which were noted.</p> <p>(d) Parking of cars outside the church The Clerk reported that he had received a call from WSCC saying that when inspected there were no cars for sale on the land.
