22/06	COMMENTS FROM THE COUNTY AND DISTRICT COUNCILLORS Cllr Mrs Freeman expressed her concern about extra houses in the Littlehampton area with the problems of water shortages and traffic (especially as there was no money for the A27 works). She also said WSCC were disputing the plan to dump London's waste in the country. Cllr Taft introduced himself to members. He was asked to monitor Arun DC's intentions on the West Bank to ensure that Clymping is a consultee.	
23/06	ADMINISTRATION (a) Play Area Cllr Baird reported that work on the play area would start in the next three to four weeks. (b) Village Hall Management Committee Cllr Bye reported that work to the hall was progressing well and that it would be complete by mid September. (c) Prison Escapes Cllr Mrs Edge reported on the meeting with a representative from Ford Parish Council and the Governor. She felt it had been a good meeting and that the governor had thought the removal of all the prisoners had been an over-reaction. The governor was willing to attend a future meeting and members felt this

25/06	<p>PLANNING</p> <p>(a) Planning Lists 21-26 (Cllr Biss declared an interest and left the meeting. Cllr Baird declared an interest and left the meeting for the second item) CM04/06 8 Wooldridge Walk Members agreed to oppose this development on the basis that it was an overdevelopment of the site and affected the homogeneous nature of the estate.</p> <p>CM6/06L – Church House Members had no objection to this proposal.</p> <p>(b) Parish Plan The Chairman outlined the progress on this matter and confirmed that once he had information from Ford he would be in a position to circulate to members the proposed questionnaire for the parish. Members agreed to progress to that point.</p>	Clerk
26/06	<p>HIGHWAYS</p> <p>(a) Transport Group The following matters were particularly highlighted: HGV Monitoring – The Group would be meeting with WSCC in the next few days to see about this. VAS on Ferry Road – The problems with this were ongoing but Cllr Taylor was dealing with this in connection with WSCC Hire of Speed check machine – Again, this is ongoing. Meeting with other local interests – This will be arranged shortly. Bus Services in parish – Cllr Bye is going to investigate this and report back.</p>	
27/06	<p>ENVIRONMENT</p> <p>(a) Clymping Gap Cllr Biss reported on the Littlehampton Vision and the possible impact this could have on the parish. The Group had now developed a constitution and at a later meeting would be discussing managed re-alignment.</p> <p>(b) Waste Area Forum Cllr Taylor reported on this matter and confirmed that he would attend future meetings.</p>
