28/05	APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE Apologies were received from Cllrs Baird and Taylor	
29/05	MATTERS OF URGENCY NOT ON THE AGENDA The Chairman mentioned that Mr Leggo, who came to do a presentation at the last parish council meeting was being tried in the media with regard to matters arising when he was Clerk at Arundel.	
30/05	MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF 7 JULY 2006 The Minutes of the meeting of 7 July 2006 were confirmed.	
31/05	MATTERS ARISING There were no matters arising	
32/05	DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST There were no declarations of interest.	
33/05	COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC Mr Baird asked about speeding in Clymping Street and the Chairman replied that they were aware of the problem, the speed warning system was being trialed and if successful may be used elsewhere in the parish. Mr Baird also reported that the groynes along the beach had been repaired.	
34/05	COMMENTS FROM COUNCILLORS There were no comments from the Councillors	
35/05	ADMINISTRATION (a) Cllr Sawyer Members welcomed Cllr Sawyer and it was agreed he should be seconded to the Environment Group. (b) Future of Worthing and Chichester Hospitals The Clerk reported on the response he had received from the MPs and the Trust to the letter expressing concern about plans for these hospitals. Members agreed to keep this matter under review. (c) Play Area The Clerk reported that Cllr Baird had informed him there were administrative delays in getting this project started but that it should be completed for the autumn. Members agreed to write expressing their displeasure with the delays and asking what further problems were being experienced. (b) Community Activities Cllr Sawyer raised the question of whether a Community Directory for the parish could be prepared listing all the activities which went on in the area. Members agreed that this could form part of the local plan preparations and that also Cllr Sawyer could contact the secretaries of the Village and Church Halls where most of the activities were concentrated. There was also a discussion about opening the Village Hall to parishioners regularly so there could be a community evening where people would get to know each other.	Clerk

36/05	<p>FINANCE</p> <p>(a) Grant to Arun Community Transport Group Members agreed to make a £100 donation to this group which provided significant services in the local community.</p>	
37/05	<p>PLANNING</p> <p>(a) Planning Lists 27-32 CM8/06 – Paintball games at Baird’s Farm After a full discussion members decided two to two with the Chairman’s casting vote and one abstention to oppose this application on the ground that it did not fulfil the requirements for development in the strategic gap as identified in the Local Plan and that there were concerns about the possibility of future commercial uses.</p> <p>(b) Parish Plan The Chairman reported that a group of two councillors from each parish together with two non-councillors had been organised to take the parish plan forward and that he would report back with more information as matters progressed.</p>	Clerk
38/05	<p>HIGHWAYS</p> <p>(a) Transport Group The following matters were particularly highlighted: The temporary changes in personnel at Drayton Office with the temporary secondment of Bob Mander. The fact that Cllr Bye was investigating public transport in the parish and would report back That the transport group would be keeping an eye on traffic movements in connection with the Grab It and Tip It business on Baird’s Farm.</p>	
39/05	<p>ENVIRONMENT</p> <p>(a) The West Bank of the Arun The Chairman thought it was about time the council should investigate the possible future uses of the West Bank and the impact that would have on managed realignment of Clymping beach and traffic up and down Ferry Road. While Cllr Biss felt this was premature and Cllr Freeman (in her capacity as Chair of the Harbour Board) said she would keep an eye on matters, the Chairman felt that the Environment Group should come up with a policy on this matter. It was agreed that Cllr Sawyer would arrange an Environment Group meeting to this end.</p>	Sawyer
