01/06	<p>APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE Apologies were received from Cllr Biss due to his inability to get to the first part of the meeting</p>	
02/06	<p>MATTERS OF URGENCY NOT ON THE AGENDA The Chairman said the West Sussex Waste Development plan was under review and members needed to be aware of issues affecting Ford Airfield.</p>	
03/06	<p>MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF 28 SEPTEMBER 2006 The Minutes of the meeting of 28 September 2006 were confirmed.</p>	
04/06	<p>DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST Cllrs Baird and Sawyer declared interests in the Affordable Housing development, Cllr Baird declared interests in the Farm Shop, the Village Hall and West Bank proposals and Cllr Bye declared an interest in the Village Hall.</p>	
05/06	<p>COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC Mr Baird welcomed the decision of Arun DC to approve the paintball activity and expressed concern about the report of the Transport Group contacting units on Hobbs Farm which he felt as an intrusion in the private business of the owners and tenants there. The Chairman felt the language used was intemperate and explained that the move was being made solely in order to make friendly contact with local businesses and monitor HGV movements in the Parish. Mr. Sawyer confirmed this and Mrs. Edge stated that County Highways and JDAC were now concerned about HGV movements in the area and appreciated constructive cooperation from the Parish Council.</p>	
06/06	<p>COMMENTS FROM COUNCILLORS Cllr Haymes reported that Arun DC were investigating the firework display planned for 11 Nov at Arun View and that he had been assured the display would not be as noisy as last year.</p>	
07/06	<p>ADMINISTRATION</p> <p>(a) Play Area Cllr Baird confirmed that this was complete but there were some outstanding snagging issues which would be dealt with over the next few days.</p> <p>(b) Village Hall Cllr Taylor reported that the works to the toilets were almost complete but that it was unlikely proposals to install curtains on the stage (for which £2000 had been set aside) would be started before Christmas. Plans for refurbishment of the kitchen and lighting in the car park were being considered.</p> <p>(c) Parish Plan Cllr Sawyer reported that Mr Bean had not recently been able to give the plan the attention it deserved but that things were progressing and that he was checking with Ford as to their public consultation process.</p> <p>(d) Community Activities Cllr Sawyer produced a list of activities in the Church Hall and Village Hall</p>	

	<p>which was welcomed by members and confirmed he would check over venues before producing a final copy. He stated that he hoped to have this list ready for inclusion in the next Clymping Village Newsletter in December</p> <p>(e) State of District Debate Cllr Taylor reported on his attendance at this meeting and his input which had been to develop the theme of welcoming new people to the district.</p>	
08/06	<p>FINANCE</p> <p>(a) Payment of accounts It was agreed to pay the following accounts: BTCV subscription - £225.63 Poppy Appeal - £50.00</p> <p>(b) Precept for 2006/07. It was agreed that this should remain at £8,000</p> <p>(c) Clerks and Councils Direct It was agreed to circulate this magazine between members before deciding whether to subscribe.</p>	Members
09/06	<p>PLANNING</p> <p>(a) Planning Lists 39-43 CM14/06 Church Farm Cottage CM15/06 Well House reapplication CM18/06 Rifle Range CM19/06 Atherington Lodge Members had no objection to any of these applications but Cllr Mrs Edge confirmed that supplemental comments had already been made in respect of CM15/06.</p> <p>(b) Crematorium The Chairman reported that he had attended a meeting on this matter and that it was not likely that traffic movements would be significant.</p> <p>(c) Planning Training Cllr Mrs Edge outlined the results of the planning training including the new Local Development Framework and the system of e-planning which was going to require much more prompt returns on planning applications.</p> <p>(d) Planning Appeal re Affordable Housing nr Rudford Estate The Clerk reported on this public inquiry which it was agreed a representative should attend to express concerns about the proposal. It was also agreed that investigations be made into whether there is a need within the business community for affordable housing for workers.</p> <p>(e) West Bank The Chairman reported that this was a “work in progress” still and that he would report back.</p>	Planning Group
10/06	<p>HIGHWAYS</p> <p>(a) Transport Group The following matters were particularly highlighted: The use of a SID: Cllr Taylor reported that this had been sited in the wrong location and that he is arranging for a second booking and to clear some branches so the sight lines for the SID are improved at the chosen spot. 11/06	<p>ENVIRONMENT</p> <p>(a) Clean Neighbourhoods Act Cllr Sawyer reported on the seminar he had attended but members felt that the Parish Council would not be involved in organising wardens.</p> <p>(b) Bus Shelters The Clerk reported that second-hand bus shelters were available at £2000 each but it was agreed not to purchase any.</p> <p>(c) Pound Cllr Bye reported that the seat in the pound was broken and Cllr Taylor undertook to see about its repair.</p> <p>(d) Dog Fouling It was agreed to take up with Arun DC the problem of dog fouling in the parish, particularly on the beach.</p>	<p>Taylor</p> <p>Clerk</p>
