





1. PRESENTATION

Before the main meeting members presented an engraved gift to Mrs Rudderham to acknowledge her many years service on the parish council.

2. MINUTES

The Minutes of the last Annual Parish Meeting were read by the Clerk and signed as a correct record.

3. ANNUAL REPORT

Cllr Baird thanked the retiring Councillors (Cllrs Kettel, Shorrocks and Liddiard) for their help on the last Parish Council and outlined the work they had done during their terms of office. He also welcomed the new members (Cllrs Mrs Baird, Shorrocks and Mr James Baird). He then referred to the liaison work carried on between the parish council and Southern Water Services concerning the works being built in connection with the new sewage works at Ford. He reported that during the year the parish council had made grants to both the School and the Parish Hall and that the money for the school had been used to help fund a computer and connection to the internet. He called on those present to come up with other schemes which the Council could assist with and which would benefit the parish.

4. ACCOUNTS

The statement of account was presented by the Clerk who pointed out that the council had a healthy balance at the present time.

5. REPORTS

Due to the election and other commitments Cllr Wotherspoon was not able to submit a report on the relationship with Arun.


(b) Schools

There being no further business the meeting then closed.



