A high scoring friendly at Chelmer Park saw plenty of batting practice, although the bowlers fared not so well. Mersea were inserted and were reduced to 46 for 3, with first eleven opener Adam Rutter falling for a duck. Luke Conway (60) and Peter Phillips (38) put on 103 for the fifth wicket, and with useful cameos from Storrar, James Rutter, Bruton and Fahie, Mersea reached a useful total of 232.

However, it quickly became apparent that the score was going to be no way near a competitive total as Devinish slaughtered the Mersea bowling with an unbeaten 131. He was also given good support from Panjwani who scored 54 in a second wicket stand of 159 as Chelmsford raced to an eight wicket victory in 32 overs.
