Totham won the toss and elected to bat and were soon making use the below average wicket and rapid outfield as runs flowed. Powell led the way with 121, and was given good support by B Mays (53) in a second wicket stand of 148. Kendall (40*) and Harris (28) added a final flourish of 85 for the seventh wicket and Totham reached 284 for 6 from their 45 overs. Trevor Vince with 2 for 37 from 10 overs was the pick of the Mersea bowlers.

Mersea never looked like threatening the visitors total although there were sizeable contributions from Trevor Vince (43*), James Tilsley (39) and Mike Srinivasan (39) and a generous 41 extras as Mersea eventually totalled 224 for 8.
