The Ipswich side slumping from 88 for 4 to 111 all out. Steve Sheldrick nipped in with two wickets.

The Mersea reply did not get off to the best of starts as Simon Lambert was bowled without a run on the board. Richard Fuller (27) and Luke Conway (55) then took the attack to the visitors and put Mersea well in command, before Gregor Irvine (10\*) and Steve Sheldrick (7\*) wrapped proceedings up inside 18 overs.
