The cup campaign came to an abrupt end at Thrid Division Little Baddow. A game that was re-arranged due to a pitch being under water (even though it is on a hill) saw a much weakened Mersea side missing a number of regulars, playing a stronger Baddow side in a twenty over midweek thrash. Baddow batted first and struggled early on as Alex Young gave the top order a stern test with 2 for 10 from his 4 overs. However, once he was out of the attack the bowling became less disciplined and Baddow made runs rapidly. A 71 run stand for the fourth wicket between Harris and Bucknell allowed the onslaught to occur as the home side propelled their score to 179 for 9 at the close. Steve Sheldrick took three late wickets

The Mersea run chase was undone early on with Rutter, Mills and Alex Young all back in the hutch with single figures to their names. Luke Conway blasted 42 from 16 balls which included five sixes to raise the islander hopes. However, his demise effectively saw the cup campaign come to its end. Ian Young (23) and John O'Regan (18) reached double figures as Mersea eventually were bowled in the 19th over in growing darkness for 137.
