Lexden were the visitors to The Glebe for the second time in six weeks having lost to West Mersea in the preliminary round of the Cup at the start of May. Both sides were promoted from Division Three last year, and Lexden after a sticky start have started to settle in with two good victories over Great Bromley and Great Totham.

Nod Goodridge won the toss and elected to bat on a wicket that had taken a lot of water during the previous week.

Mersea batted poorly collapsing to 46 for 8, as Colin Hayward caused the damage with 5 for 15. Trevor Vince (34*) and Tom Sanderson (25) took Mersea to respectability with a ninth wicket stand of 60, but shortly after with the score on 111 Mersea were dismissed, with incredibly all ten batsmen bowled !

Lexden in reply made there way to the target in a watchful manner, with all the Mersea bowlers returning economical spells. Trevor Vince bowled an incredible spell that saw only 3 runs come from the bat, however, he struggled with his direction bowling 14 wides. C Martin top scored for the visitors with an unbeaten 44 as they got home by 8 wickets in the 40th over, a defeat for Mersea which saw them slip to the foot of the table.
