FASH Chat - Christmas and New Year double edition

It is some years since I have had the privilege of providing this particular FASH Chat and I will take another look at some seasonal customs and traditions, with information mainly gleaned from Google.

Let's look at First Footing to start with. It is mainly a Scottish custom (when does a custom become a tradition or vice versa?), which requires a young man, preferably handsome and healthy and with dark hair, to be the first person to knock at your door after midnight on 31st December / 1st January, carrying some coal, money and salt to ensure that you have health, wealth and happiness in the coming year.

Auld Langs Syne is a song which we also associate with Scotland, mistakenly on the whole. Although the words are from Robert Burns, they were set to music in the 1920's and made famous by Guy Lombardo and his Royal Canadians in London, Ontario, Canada. They played this number at the New Year celebrations at the Roosevelt Hotel in New York in 1929 and a tradition was born. Radio made it famous world wide and Auld Lang Syne is now justly famous as the song that everyone knows but nobody knows the words to!!

The New Year is the most important holiday in Japan, and is a symbol of renewal. In December, various Bonenkai or "forget-the-year parties" are held to bid farewell to the problems and concerns of the past year and prepare for a new beginning. Misunderstandings and grudges are forgiven and houses are scrubbed. At midnight on December 31st, Buddhist temples strike their gongs 108 times, in an effort to expel 108 types of human

weakness. Children receive otoshidamas on New Years Day, small gifts with money inside. Sending New Year's cards is a popular tradition—if postmarked by a certain date, the Japanese post office guarantees delivery of all New Year's cards on January 1st.

Wassailing has been associated with Christmas and the New Year since about 1440 and is thought to be an old Saxon custom whereby the lord of the manor would greet his dependants with 'waes hael' at the beginning of the new year and they would respond with 'drinc hael' ('be well' and 'drink and be healthy').

The wassail bowl was filled with spiced ale or cider and over the centuries developed into different customs - taking the bowl around the local homes and farms to wish everyone a happy new year in return for seasonal food such as mince pies, filling a common bowl known as a loving cup to share amongst a gathering or a celebration and blessing for the apple harvest. The date for wassailing was generally on or about 17th January, the old Twelfth Night.

Twelfth Night nowadays is generally accepted as 6th January in the UK, but we don't tend to mark or celebrate it in any way except vaguely perhaps as the day to take down our Christmas decorations, as if they are not taken down then, they should remain up for the rest of the year or risk bad luck.

I hope to see more of you in 2012, and in the meantime local events to celebrate Christmas and New Year will be found at the websites of the various Morris sides and have a look at the raggy costumes of the Otterbourne Mummers.
