Proved at London 30th December 1619 before the Right Worshipful John Dauterney Sr. of Law and Surrogate by the Oath of Sarah Greu & widow the Widow David Greu and Charles Greu the sons and executors to whom admou was granted being first sworn duly to administer.

This is the last Will and Testament of me Elizabeth Lambert Gorwyn of Lambert otherwise Lambford or situate within the parish of Crediton Diocese in the County of Devon Spinster first I give to my brother John the sum of twenty one pounds also I give to my brother in law George Arden and to Joan his wife the sum of fifty pounds apiece also I give to Diana Cam my sister the sum of ten pounds also I give to my brother George the sum of ten pounds also I give to my nephew George the son of my brother George the sum of ten pounds also I give to Joan Gorwyn of Crediton in the parish of Crediton my nephew the sum of ten pounds also I give to my nephew William Lambert Gorwyn the sum of ten pounds also I give to my niece Ann the wife of John Gorwyn of the parish of Crediton or Dampstead in the County of Devon the sum of fifteen pounds also I give unto Francis Arden Mary Arden George Arden and Francis Christopher Arden and Ann Arden being children of my brother in law George Arden and Joan his now wife the sum of forty pounds apiece which said several legacies above mentioned shoud be paid to the said legacies respectively in lawful English money at the end of one year after my death also I give to three others being the children of George Arden and Joan his now wife (that is to say) Charlotte, Henry and Joan the like sum of forty pounds apiece of lawful English money when they severally arrive to the age of twenty one years respectively also I give to my two nieces daughters of my brother in law John Arden the sum of thirty one pounds and ten shillings apiece when they arrive to their respective ages of twenty one years also I give to the poor of the parish of Crediton Diocese in the said County the sum of forty shillings to be distributed amongst them by my executor as soon as convenient after my death and lastly I give devise and bequeath to my niece Elizabeth Arden all and singular my freehold and other lands consisting of several houses tenements messuages and farms whosoever or whatsoever situated and called or known by whatsoever name or names with the appurtenances respectively belonging to the said lands houses tenements messuages and farms as appurtenances with the appurtenances unto the said Elizabeth Arden my niece her heirs and assigns for ever and as to all the rest residue and remainder of my goods chattels real and effects of what kind or nature soever it may be after paying the said several legacies my funeral charges my just debts and the expense of proving this my will I give the same also to my niece Elizabeth Arden whom I hereby make certain whole and sole executrix of this my last will and Testament thereby revoking all former wills and wills Codicil and Codicils by me made ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament written on two sheets of paper in witness whereof I have to the first sheet put my

hand and to the persons or last effect my hand and seal the 4th
next day of January and in the year of our lord one thousand
eight hundred and sixteen Elizabeth Lambert Goveryn ^(D) signed
sealed published and declared by the aforesaid Elizabeth Lambert
Goveryn the Testatrix to be and for her last will and Testament in
the presence of us who have herunto subscribed our names as
witnesses in the presence of the Testatrix and in the presence of

Appeared Personally William Cann of Southampton in
the County of Devon squire and William Tucker of Dartmouth
in the said County of Devon Yeoman and made oath that they
knew and were well acquainted with Elizabeth Lambert Goveryn
late of Exeter Bishop in the County of Devon Spinster & a
deceased and having often seen her write and subscribe her name
are thereby also become well acquainted with her manner and
character of handwriting and subscription and having now a
carefully viewed and perused the paper writing thereto annexed
purporting to be a Copy to the last will and Testament of the
said deceased being in the words following to wit in my last
will and Testament I have bequeathed a legacy to my niece the
Miss Bryants which legacy I have as having paid it during
my life given under my hand this fourth day of December in
the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and sixteen
and thus subscribed Elizabeth Lambert Goveryn these beforesaid

Proved at London ^{with a spirit} 31 December 1819 before the Judge by the
Oath of Elizabeth Arden Spinster the sole Executrix to whom a
